"I Know Whom I Have Believed"

2 Timothy 1:12: For the which cause I also suffer these things: nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that He is able to keep that which I have committed unto Him against that day.

Paul's response to trials is remarkable. In **2 Timothy 1:8-11**, he pointed out that serving God led him to be persecuted. Despite these hardships, Paul expressed joy, peace, hope, zeal, and endurance through his sufferings. In **2 Timothy 1:12**, he expressed his *faith*.

Paul faced frequent rejection, yet remained steadfast. His choice to follow Christ caused Paul to suffer hardships many cannot fathom (2 Cor. 11:24-27). Through it all, Paul showed no signs of backing down in his efforts to serve God.

What makes a person stand so steadfast? Paul gives a key part of the answer in **2 Timothy 1:12**. He was persuaded that God is to be trusted. Paul's faith produced a confidence that made the things he suffered seem *light* (**2 Cor. 4:17**).

By focusing on "the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" (Heb. 11:1), we can, like Paul, endure hardships with peace and steadfastness. We can genuinely proclaim "I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that He is able to keep that which I have committed unto Him against that day."

A Search for Meaning

Ecclesiastes 12:13-14: Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep His commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil."

King Solomon spent much of his life searching for meaning and fulfillment of purpose. He sought (and acquired) nearly everything the world deems to be life's aim. He gained wealth, possessions, pleasure, popularity, prestige, education, and accomplishments, yet concluded "vanity of vanities; all is vanity" (Eccl. 1:2).

After explaining several things that did not bring fulfillment, Solomon, by inspiration, ended Ecclesiastes by stating what does. "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter." he said.

Life is not about gaining earthly wealth, fame, or prestige, although such may not be wrong. Life's meaning goes deeper than being a good spouse, parent, or neighbor, although these things *result* from fulfilling one's purpose in life.

At its core, life is about glorifying and pleasing God. There is a "hole" inside of us that only God can fill. There is a longing for fulfillment that is satisfied by serving Him.

May we heed the wisdom offered us by the Holy Spirit and "Fear God, and keep His commandments: for this is the whole duty of man."

"By Way of Remembrance"

God promised Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob that all nations of the earth would be blessed through their seed (Gen. 12:3; 26:4; 28:14). God foretold of a time their descendants would be in captivity, but He assured that they would "come out with great substance" (Gen. 15:13-14).

In Exodus 2, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob's descendants were in Egyptian bondage, and "God remembered His covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob. And God looked upon the children of Israel, and God had respect unto them" (verses 24-25). Upon remembering, God led the Israelites out of bondage. God exhorted the Israelites to remember Him, as He remembered them. He instituted the Passover to remind them of what He had done for them (Exod. 12).

While the Israelites were to observe the Passover to remember God, Christians observe the Lord's Supper to remember Christ (1 Cor. 11:24-25).

More generally, Christians should remember God's will throughout our lives.

As Peter wrote to Christians, he wrote to "stir up [their] pure minds by way of remembrance" (2 Pet. 3:1).

The Israelites who left Egypt forgot God (Exod. 16:3; 17:3; Numb. 14:2). May we never lose sight of who our Creator, Master, and Savior is, but constantly pray, study, and think on God's Word, remembering Christ and His will for us.
