Elijah, or not?

Read: Matthew 11:14 & John 1:21 **Question:** Was John the Elijah of prophecy? Why then do the answers Jesus and John give differ?

Answer: These questions stern from the remarks of the prophet Malachi. As he pens the final words of his prophecy he writes. "Behold, I am going to send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and terrible day of the Lord. And he will restore the hearts of the fathers to their children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers. Lest I come a smite the land with a curse." Malachi 4:5-6.

When certain priests and Levites asked John if he was in fact Elijah, he responded, "I am not." However, when Jesus spoke to the multitude, who had gone out to hear John preach, He told them John "is Elijah, who was to come". Are these two contradicting one another? Did Jesus know John's true identity and history wile John himself was yet ignorant? No! Both Jesus and John knew and spoke the truth. The answers to these questions reside in who was being spoken to. Jesus spoke to a crowd of people who went to learn and obey John's teaching. John spoke to a delegation sent by the rulers to question his teaching. These rulers misunderstood the message of Malachi. They were expecting Elijah to be physically reincarnated, and John certainly was not that. John on the other hand, had prepared the hearts of the people, in the character of Elijah, before the Lord came on the scene. This is what Jesus testifies to the crowd; John was the messenger Flijah of Malachi's prophecy

What About The Thief?

The thief on the cross is sometimes held up as a model of salvation by those who teach that faith alone is enough to save. It is strange that we would advocate a thief as the example to follow, but it is true that He was saved (Lk. 23:43). Whether he was baptized we cannot know for certain because the Bible does not say. We do know; however, that he was not baptized into Christ as those on the day of Pentecost and thereafter were. Does this mean that we can be saved today without being baptized? **Not at all!** Here is why the thief on the cross is not an example of salvation for us to model.

Christ was still alive.

This condemned thief was living under a different law than you and I do. He was still living under the Law of Moses, but now we live under the las of Christ (1 Cor. 9:20-21). The law of Christ states that we must: believe (Ac. 16:30-31), repent (Ac. 2:38), confess Jesus as Christ (Rom 10:9-11), and be baptized (Ac. 22:16 Saul still had sins that needed to be washed away.) His law or will, like any man's last will and testament, did not go into force until he died (Heb. 9:16-17). Jesus still had the right to give what he had to anyone He chose. This is the same as men today

who give away what they have to their family and friends. Christ had the power to forgive sins with a word while He walked this earth, and He did so to more than just the thief (Matt. 9:2. Now, however, His will is in effect and His will states that for men to be saved they must be baptized.

Peter made the relationship that baptism has with salvation very plain when he wrote, "And corresponding to that, baptism now saves you—not the removal of dirt from the flesh, but an appeal to God for a good conscience—through the resurrection of Jesus Christ" 1 Pet. 3:21. Batpism saves, that's that the Bible says.
