What the Seat Can

Every now and then we are treated to the wisdom that "the mind can only absorb what the seat can endure". This is offered to prompt preachers to be brief. I do not favor repetitious sermons or rambling discourses with apparent design. Every speaker needs to build rapport with his audience and be alert to signs of weariness or loss of interest. Every speaker cannot hold an audience for long periods of time.

But it needs to be said that the seat can endure whatever the mind wills. Whatever occupies the mind will determine very often what the seat can endure. That is what enables people to sit for hours to drive to a vacation spot or to see relatives long missed. That is what empowers us to stay strapped in a seat on a jet plane across country, or half way around the world. That is what caused me to sit for seven hours in a school taught by a physical therapist a few weeks after back surgery, with only a five minute stretch every hour. That is what causes people to sit through baseball double-headers and football games. The mind wills it and the seat endures it.

The saying is catchy and usually draws a laugh, but it is actually the reverse of the truth. Let's get it straight – "The seat can endure what the mind wills it to endure."

Discouraging, But Not Discouraged

There is a story common to us all. The names of people and places may be different, the setting may vary from recital to recital, but the plot is always the same. Though circumstances were discouraging, confidence in the Lord kept us from being discouraged. The apostle Paul gives his own account of victory in the Lord over less than preferred conditions in his letter to the church in Thessalonica (1 Thess. 2).

Paul reminds the Thessalonians that just before coming into their city he had been preaching in the city of Philippi where he was mistreated. However, he continued to do what the Lord willed him to. He traveled to Thessalonica and the taught same message continued teaching it while some tried to hinder him. Paul's preaching trips were filled wit \h discouraging events but he was not discouraged because the trips were also filled with good. People were hearing God's good news and were obeying it.

Paul continues to remind the Thessalonians about his conduct while he was with them he did not want to leave the false impression that he was peaching the gospel for money or fame, so he calls to their mind how he supported himself while he taught them. Useful study, mental work, is strenuous enough but to then add to it physical labor and any man might buckle under this workload. Paul, however, would rather wear out himself than allow the gospel to be worn out in the mind of those he taught by lies about his motives. Paul's work was often discouraging but he was not discouraged because good was being done. People were hearing God's good news and were obeying it.

Paul finally writes that he knows he was not the only one to suffer. Many who had obeyed the gospel in Thessalonica had been persecuted by their neighbors. Persecution of any kind is discouraging to a person, but to see others suffer only multiplies the pain.
