# **Looking Toward Heaven**

#### I. Introduction

A. After assuring that the "day of the Lord" *will* come, the Holy Spirit through Peter notes the need to be prepared for that Day. He also notes the appropriateness for those who *are* prepared to look forward to that Day and what will become reality for the righteous at that time – eternal life in *heaven*. **2 Peter 3:10-13** 

## II. A Home for the *Righteous*

A. The passage notes a key reason heaven is something to look forward to – it will be free from sin and darkness, a place where *righteousness* dwells. **2 Peter 3:13**; **Matthew 7:21** 

### III. A Home with the Righteous

A. This is connected to a second truth about heaven that gives us reason to look forward to it – heaven is a place where the righteous of all ages will be *together*. 1 **Thessalonians 4:16-17** 

#### IV. A Home Where *God* Dwells

A. Moreover, heaven is a place where the righteous of all ages will be in *God's* direct presence forever. 1 Thessalonians 4:17; Mark 16:19

#### V. A Permanent Home

A. The word "forever" denotes another beauty of heaven to look forward to. The comfort of being with the Lord in a place free from darkness will be enjoyed for *eternity*.

1 Thessalonians 4:17; Philippians 3:20

#### VI. A Home of Comfort and Rest

A. Looking forward to heaven is also appropriate when we consider that it will be free from death, mourning, crying, and pain. **Revelation 21:4**; **Hebrews 4:9** 

## VII. A Home with Ample Room

A. Furthermore, heaven is not a place like earthly homes that will run out of room. There is plenty of space there for *all* who choose righteousness. **John 14:1-3** 

#### VIII. A Home Worth the *Trials*

- A. Looking forward to heaven involves looking toward a home that is far more valuable than all the "treasures" the world can offer. **Matthew 6:19-20**
- B. Given the value of heaven, any and all trials we must face in order to spend eternity there are more than worth it. Matthew 5:11-12; Romans 8:18

## IX. A Home That Gives *Hope*

A. Heaven is the object of the faithful Christian's *hope*. Given the beauty of heaven, we have no greater future comfort to *desire* than heaven. Given God's faithfulness and the resurrection of His Son, we can *confidently expect* that heaven will one day be a *reality* for the righteous. The combination of these truths produces a sure and steadfast anchor for the righteous. **Colossians 1:5**; **Hebrews 6:19** 

## X. Conclusion

A. May we live in mindfulness of all that heaven offers. 2 Peter 3:13
